In reading each week we have a new story from our hardback reader, and sometimes a paperback reader story. After reading the story, please discuss the story elements: character(s), setting, main idea, details, and genre. Students will take an A.R. test on their weekly stories. Their scores will be averaged together for a reading grade. Please have your child read nightly! Parent/Teacher Conferences are coming up. (September 20 & 22) Please take time to call the office to schedule for a conference. We are looking forward to seeing you.

Reminders: •School begins at 8:15, please be on time. We dive into learning after tardy bell rings. Students begin morning seatwork at this time. •Sign nightly homework sheet (Keep in RED Team notebook until Friday). Sign and check your child's homework papers (Math and Vocabulary Sentences). •TIC – Papers with TIC (Together in Class) are completed together as a whole class. •Send clean water bottles to school on Mondays.
